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### **Oceaneering Announces \$100MM Revolving Credit Agreement with Five Banks**

July 1, 2003 – Houston, Texas – Oceaneering International, Inc. (NYSE:OII) announced that it has entered into a four-year, \$100 million revolving credit agreement with Wells Fargo Bank Texas, National Association (Wells Fargo), HSBC Bank USA (HSBC), Comerica Bank (Comerica), Den norske Bank ASA, and The Bank of Tokyo-Mitsubishi, Ltd. The amount available under the credit agreement can be increased to \$125 million at any time upon the agreement of Oceaneering and existing or additional lenders.

The new facility will be available for general corporate purposes. The new credit agreement contains similar restrictive maintenance covenants as the Company's existing indebtedness relative to the level of debt to total capitalization, interest coverage, and minimum net worth. Wells Fargo, HSBC and Comerica acted as administrative agent, documentation agent and syndication agent, respectively.

Marvin J. Migura, Senior Vice President and Chief Financial Officer, stated, "We are extremely pleased with this new financing arrangement and the confidence demonstrated by these world class financial institutions. The revolver of \$100 million provides us medium-term capital at a favorable cost. Coupled with Oceaneering's strong cash flow, this facility preserves our flexibility to fund additional growth."
