

Conflict Minerals Policy¹

Livent Corporation is committed to sourcing components and materials from companies that share our values regarding respect for human rights, integrity, and environmental responsibility.

Livent is committed to complying with Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Act, which aims to prevent the use of minerals containing tin, tantalum, tungsten and gold (3TGs) that directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or in adjoining countries

Livent monitors the materials used in the manufacture of its products, including whether any such materials include 3TGs. Suppliers to Livent are required to commit to being or becoming “conflict-free” (which means that such supplier does not source conflict minerals) and to sourcing 3TGs only from conflict-free smelters. Each supplier to Livent that provides 3TGs is required to complete EICC-GeSI Conflict Minerals Reporting Templates evidencing such supplier’s commitment to becoming conflict-free and documenting countries of origin for the 3TGs that it supplies.

¹ At the time of the writing of this Conflict Minerals Statement, the term “Conflict mineral” includes Columbite-tantalite (coltan), cassiterite, gold, wolframite, or their derivatives, which are limited to tantalum, tin and tungsten. As used in this Conflict Minerals Statement, the term “3TG” includes tin, tantalum, tungsten and gold.
